The information will serve two purposes: to help ensure an appropriate placement and to introduce your family to your AFS Participant, allowing him or her to get a first impression of what to expect as a member of your family. We must have a complete application before we can place an AFS Participant in your home, so please return all of the forms to the AFS Admissions Center or your local AFS volunteer prior to your participant's scheduled arrival in the U.S. or your home. Be sure to keep a copy for your records.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR DOUBLE PLACEMENTS (HOSTING TWO EXCHANGE PARTICIPANTS AT ONE TIME)

For families wishing to host more than one exchange participant at the same time (through AFS or through AFS and another program) the following paperwork must be submitted:

- Letter from the local high school on high school letterhead (obtained by the local volunteer)
- Letter from the host family (obtained by the local volunteer)
- Letter from the natural parents (obtained by AFS Admissions)

These letters must have specific wording. Please contact your Admissions Advisor for templates for the high school and host family letter or download them from AFS Online (library, keyword: "double placement forms"). Double placements must be approved by the US Department of State prior to the second participant moving into the home. Therefore, it is important to submit these complete forms approximately two weeks before the second participant moves into the home.

Form F Host Family Agreement

The purpose of this agreement is to fully inform host family members of their rights and responsibilities as an AFS Host Family. Throughout the hosting experience, host parents are urged to call their AFS Liaison with any questions that arise. The signature on the bottom of the form indicates that an AFS Volunteer has explained the contents of the agreement to you. A copy of this agreement should be kept for your records.

AGREEMENT: HOST FAMILY RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Our family agrees to host an AFS Exchange Participant. We have had an interview with an AFS representative and at that time received the U.S. State Department Code of Federal Regulations Title 22 Part 62—Exchange Visitor Program. Additionally all members of the household 18 and over will complete a criminal background check per such regulations.

As a host family, we have a right to:

1. Expect the AFS Participant to be a full family member inasmuch as it is possible.
2. Be assigned an AFS Liaison who will be in regular contact with us and with our participant to monitor progress.
3. Contact the AFS Liaison for help with adjustment issues.
4. Have access to AFS Staff through a 24-hour emergency number.

As a host family, we agree to:

1. Provide a safe and nurturing environment, and treat the participant as a member of our family.
2. Provide the participant with his or her own bed.
3. Provide the participant with meals (including lunches and meals eaten as a family in restaurants).
4. Provide access to a fully functioning telephone in your home that the participant may use in the event of an emergency.
5. Accept basic, everyday expenses incurred by having the participant in our home.
6. Ensure that the participant has transportation to and from school.
7. Ensure that the participant attends and takes full part in AFS activities and orientations during the exchange.
8. Attend orientations and activities held for host families whenever possible.
9. Ensure that our family and our participant have contact with the AFS Liaison or other designated AFS Volunteer on at least a monthly basis, as required by law, and be as flexible as possible in arranging time in our schedule and that of our participant to meet with or talk with our AFS Liaison or other designated AFS Volunteer.
10. Assist our participant in having a successful experience in school, seeking help from the AFS Liaison if the participant is experiencing unusual academic difficulties.
11. Encourage the participant to limit communication with home-country friends and family as recommended in the AFS-USA communication guidelines stated in the Host Family Handbook.
12. Abide by guidelines for natural family visits and contact our AFS Liaison immediately should a natural family member propose to visit the participant during the exchange period.
13. Always notify the AFS Liaison (or, in the event that the liaison is not available, AFS Staff or another volunteer) in a timely manner for the following reasons:
 - a. If our family and/or the participant is away from home for more than 24 hours, giving contact details in case of an emergency.
 - b. If serious issues arise, including but not limited to: serious illness, injury, or hospitalization; arrest or detention by authorities; violation of AFS rules regarding driving, hitchhiking or use of illegal drugs; potentially harmful behavior including alcohol consumption.
 - c. If we learn that our participant has had unexcused absences from school, has missed classes or is having other academic problems.
 - d. If we are considering hosting any other exchange participant, even if on a temporary basis, so that the U.S. State Department and the participant's natural family can be contacted for approval of the double placement.
 - e. If contact from the natural family (via phone, letter, or e-mail) interferes with the participant's adaptation process.

As a host family, we understand that:

1. The AFS Participant will come with spending money for optional activities or purchases during the exchange period.
2. We are not the legal guardians of the AFS Participant.
3. We may sign forms for school-related activities by crossing out the words "Parent/Guardian" and writing in "Host Family" to make the relationship clear.
4. We must obtain the signature of the natural parents or guardians in the participant's home country for any other documents requiring natural parent or legal guardian signature.
5. AFS has the sole responsibility for determining host family placements.

11. AFS Participants have a right to legal representation if questioned or detained by police. In such a situation, we should contact our local volunteer or AFS Staff immediately so that they can assist our participant in arranging for an attorney.

As a host family, we are aware of the specifics of the AFS Participant medical plan as outlined in the Host Family Handbook and understand that:

2. Claims should be submitted, preferably by the medical service provider, directly to Global Benefits as outlined in the AFS Host Family Handbook.

 - b. routine eye exams, glasses or contact lenses.
 - c. routine physicals (including sports physicals), preventative care, and immunizations.
 - d. pre-existing conditions.
4. If the participant requires care as described above that is not covered by the AFS Participant Medical Plan, we will notify the AFS Liaison to arrange for natural family consent and payment.

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TITLE 22--FOREIGN RELATIONS
CHAPTER I--DEPARTMENT OF STATE
PART 62 EXCHANGE VISITOR PROGRAM
Subpart B_Specific Program Provisions
Sec. 62.24 Teachers.

(a) Purpose. These regulations govern exchange visitors who teach full-time in primary and secondary accredited educational institutions. Programs under this section promote the interchange of American and foreign teachers in public and private schools and the enhancement of mutual understanding between people of the United States and other countries. They do so by providing foreign teachers opportunities to teach in primary and secondary accredited educational institutions in the United States, to participate actively in cross-cultural activities with Americans in schools and communities, and to return home ultimately to share their experiences and their increased knowledge of the United States. Such exchanges enable visitors to understand better American culture, society, and teaching practices at the primary and secondary levels, and enhance American knowledge of foreign cultures, customs, and teaching approaches.

(b) Designation. The Department of State may, in its discretion, designate bona fide programs satisfying the objectives in section (a) above as exchange visitor programs in the teacher category.

(c) Visitor eligibility. A foreign national shall be eligible to participate in an exchange visitor program as a full-time teacher if the individual:

- (1) Meets the qualifications for teaching in primary or secondary schools in his or her country of nationality or last legal residence;
- (2) Satisfies the standards of the U.S. state in which he or she will teach;
- (3) Is of good reputation and character;
- (4) Seeks to come to the United States for the purpose of full-time teaching at a primary or secondary accredited educational institution in the United States; and
- (5) Has a minimum of three years of teaching or related professional experience.

(d) Visitor selection. Sponsors shall adequately screen teachers prior to accepting them for the program. Such screening, in addition to the requirements of Sec. 62.10(a), shall include:

- (1) Evaluating the qualifications of the foreign applicants to determine whether the criteria set forth in paragraph (c) of this section are satisfied; and
- (2) Securing references from colleagues and current or former employers, attesting to the teachers' good reputation, character and teaching skills.

(e) Teaching position. Prior to the issuance of the Form DS-2019, the exchange visitor shall receive a written offer and accept in writing of a teaching position from the primary or secondary accredited educational institution in which he or she is to teach. Such position shall be in compliance with any applicable collective bargaining agreement, where one exists. The exchange visitor's appointment to a position at a primary or secondary accredited educational institution shall be temporary, even if the teaching position is permanent.

(f) Program disclosure. Before the program begins, the sponsor shall provide the teacher, in addition to what is required in Sec. 62.10(b), with:

- (1) Information on the length and location(s) of his or her exchange visitor program;
- (2) A summary of the significant components of the program, including a written statement of the teaching requirements and related professional obligations; and
- (3) A written statement which clearly states the compensation, if any, to be paid to the teacher and any other financial arrangements in regards to the exchange visitor program.

(g) Location of the exchange. The teacher shall participate in an exchange visitor program at the primary or secondary accredited educational institution(s) listed on his or her Form DS-2019 and at locations where the institution(s) are involved in official school activities (e.g., school field trips and teacher training programs).

(h) Duration of participation. The teacher shall be authorized to participate in the Exchange Visitor Program for the length of time necessary to complete the program, which shall not exceed three years.
